**Overnight cold weather shelters open when the temperature is 34° or below. Guests MUST arrive during designated intake times.**

**East Everett Cold Weather Shelter:** 2617 Cedar St. (425) 470-7037. Intake 8PM-10PM.  
Operated by Volunteers of America Western Washington. Pets allowed. 

**Everett Family Cold Weather Shelter:** **Serves families with minor children only.** 5126 S. 2<sup>nd</sup> Ave. (425) 998-3954. Intake 4PM-8PM. Operated by Everett Gospel Mission.

**Marysville Cold Weather Shelter:** 7215 51<sup>st</sup> Ave NE. (425) 686-9272. Intake 7PM-9:30PM.  
Operated by LINC NW. Pets allowed. 

**Monroe Cold Weather Shelter:** 14118 Chain Lake Rd. (360) 926-2435. Intake 8PM-10PM.  
Operated by Volunteers of America Western Washington. Pets allowed. 

**Snohomish Cold Weather Shelter:** 210 Ave B. (425) 864-3765. Intake 8PM-10PM. Operated by Volunteers of America Western Washington. Pets allowed. 

**South County Cold Weather Shelter:** Shuttle pick-up locations below. No walk-ups. (425) 561-4680. Intake 7PM-10PM everyday but Wednesday. Intakes 9PM-11PM Wednesday.  
Operated by Volunteers of America Western Washington. Pets allowed. 

- **Lynnwood City Hall:** 19100 44<sup>th</sup> Ave W. 7PM everyday but Wednesday. 9PM Wednesday.
- **James Village:** 196<sup>th</sup> St SW & Hwy 99. 7:10PM everyday but Wednesday. 9:10PM Wednesday.
- **Value Village:** 17216 Hwy 99. 7:25PM everyday but Wednesday. 9:25 Wednesday.

# Ride Free to Cold Weather Shelters



**Community Transit & Everett Transit provide free rides to cold weather shelters whenever they open due to cold weather conditions.**

## How it works:

- Riders can use any Community or Everett Transit bus when traveling to a designated cold weather shelter.
- No special pass or ticket is required—just let the driver know you're headed to a cold weather shelter.
- Transit service is available during regular operating hours, when cold weather shelters are open.
- Policy applies to DART and Paratransit trips.
- Policy applies to Community Transit Zip vehicles (within service area)
